He also suggested, to take up a detailed study micro basins towards watershed management, changing the mindset of the people towards over water usage, change in settlement pattern and water budgeting of every village. Further he explained how society/community can be involved in water conservation and monitoring with simple techniques.

He concluded the lecture by giving an example of Bachchu Singh a villager and his conjunctive use of water for farming, who suggested "Go to water where it is! rather than making it come to you". At the end, there was a fruitful discussion by participants including students.
